- The Junior League of Dallas (JLD), founded in 1922 by 40 charter members, is dedicated to providing volunteer service and financial help throughout the Dallas community to impact the lives of families and individuals every day.
- The Junior League of Dallas reaches out to women of all races, religions and national origins who demonstrate an interest in and a commitment to voluntarism. Our membership of 5,500 plus women is proud to have an impact on our community.
- The JLD is the largest member of the Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI), which is comprised of 293 member Leagues in the U.S., Canada, Mexico, and the United Kingdom.

COMMUNITY IMPACT 2010 - 2011

- 120,000+ uncompensated hours of service to 41 JLD community projects and several service support committees.
- Provisionals (new members): 11,000+ service hours through Provisional projects to meet community needs.
- JLD members serve on numerous community boards and coalitions.
- The JLD's T. Boone Pickens Leadership Institute provides a select group of Active members with training on the critical social and community needs in Dallas, with the goal of identifying potential leaders who can make a difference in the Dallas community.
- The JLD grants more than \$1 million to support nonprofits in Dallas County, including the 39 agencies in the Community Program, as well as Provisional projects, Community Outreach projects and the Community Assistance Fund. These funds and additional resources also support the training of volunteers, which takes place within the JLD organization and through community volunteer opportunities.
- The JLD's Grants for Innovative Teaching project supports excellence in teaching by awarding grants to Dallas Independent School District teachers for unique programs that are not funded by school budgets. The League will award approximately \$75,000 in grants for the 2010-2011 school year.
- JLD funds are raised through donations from JLD members, other individuals, corporations and foundations; additional resources include grants, advertising sales, underwriting and ticket sales for the 2010 Auction & Casino Party, 2011 JLD Ball, JLD Retail, planned giving and commemorative giving.
